



This year's state road races were held on an excellent course near Jackson, La. The 22 mile course was challenging to the record number of riders who attended. In the Senior race, the pace was fairly slow for the first 50 miles, with the bunch staying together. At about this point, 5 riders rolled off the front, establishing a dangerously big gap.

The race favorites, however, did not chase. At about the 65 mile point Finklea flatted (precipitated by a broken spoke), but caught in a few miles following a fast wheel change and very quick trip through the feeding area. Darryl Robbins flatted on the next lap, and the chase group finally started to close the gap on the breakaway. At about 3 1/2 hours into the race, the break was caught, at which point the pace slowed to that of a novice race. Roberts, obviously irritated at the lackluster pace could not get anything going. Coming up to the finish, the pace sometimes slowed to 12 mph as riders considered the impending sprint. Roverts, however, had miscounted the laps (there was no bell) and failed to recognize the sprint until it was too late. Finklea won easily, with Robert and the rest following.

The Veteran's race was strong and steady throughout ending in a pack sprint including at least five riders with Jim Bergin spinning in at 220 RPM's past Mike Jenkins for third place! With the kind of talent displayed in this group we could have a terrific team time trial group in national competition.

The women's race moved at a somewhat slower pace for the first lap with Adrienne and Trudi attempting a breakaway early into the second lap. This initiated a quickening of pace which proved to be Adrienne's demise halfway through the lap. Trudi took the spring over Candy for a 1st place finish.

The Junior's race was a contest of endurance and strength between three riders John McAllister, Victor Klejman, and Stephen Apsey. Stephen punctured early on in the race causing him to drop back leaving John and Victor to battle it out to a close sprint finish 1st and 2nd, respectively.

The Intermediate's race gave Steven Ziegler a chance to show his stuff in spite of mechanical difficulties. Experiencing a gear lock in a sub 75 gear he still managed not only to ride the entire race, but to win it hands down over Mark Greco and John Dias - two up and coming young riders. With a little work Steven could be the rising star on the horizon.

Then there was the Master's race. About halfway through the first lap four surprised women riders saw a flash of color as someone yelled, "Was that rider a Senior or Vet?" Neither. It was Billy Richards - the Master - strutting his stuff. Opening a 30 minute gap on his opponent and being the Southern gentleman he always is, he then let the girls cruise on by for a better view of the scenery. A winner to the end!

Hands up to two small boys who showed great courage and true grit in braving 11 miles of tough hills to complete the midget's race with good showing and sportsmanly conduct throughout. Congratulations to two super little guys - Ira and Matthew!

#### 1982 TOUR DE LOUISIANA

The eleventh annual Tour de Louisiana was held March 20-21. This year's Tour saw some fine competition, in addition to some excellent placings by NOBC riders. In the Sr. 1 & 2 class, Brian Roberts (SRC) finished the time trial in 6th position, with Robin Robert in 12th position (of a 23-rider field). The road race that afternoon saw Robin crossing the line tirst in a sprint finish, moving him up to 7th position on General Classification. The criterium the next day, however, proved disastrous for Brian, wno punctured but managed 10th overall nevertheless. Robin, who was off the back in the final laps, gutted it out to finish 9th overall. There was some excitement at the start of the criterium stage, as one rider who had been d.q.'ed in the road stage refused to leave the start line. (He had accepted feeds from a support vehicle illegally on the course). He was finally persuaded to retire in at least two languages by the chief referee and the Florida District Representative.

The largest bunch was the Senior 3 & 4 class for which 51 riders appeared. In spite of such competition, Chris LaPorte finished first overall with John McAllister a mere 3 seconds behind. Mike Lerner finished 9th, Carl Cooke 15th and Steve Ziegler 16th.

The Veteran's race was won by Denis Carroll, who, finding himself in 3rd position after the road stage, launched a successful early breakaway with Atlanta's Jim Ratliff. Jim rapidly punctured, leaving Denis to time trial to an impressive solo victory, in spite of a puncture and wheel change in the closing laps. A fine performance was also given by Mike Jenkins (BRBC) who finished second (nearly one minute down), Brian Apsey (4th) and Jim Bergin, who finished his first stage race in 6th position of a field of 27.

The women's race was easily dominated by Jacque Phelan (Calif.), who won each stage. Adrienne Schmidt finished 3rd, with Trudi Roberts 5th in a fine race. Of a field of 14 (excellent for a women's stage race), 9 riders finished, which is a higher percentage than any of the men's events.
